Sensitive to emotionally abused children, she gets involved with one such student, Brian Stratford, the mayor's son. Brian is not his usual exuberant self, and Julia is wondering if his father's campaign for state senator is affecting him. She attempts to bring her concerns to his parents, but Brian's Uncle Connor runs interference. The family is having serious problems, and Connor sets out to distract Julia from her mission, but she becomes more than a distraction for him. His desire for Julia could cost his brother the election if secrets come out and Julia refuses to stay away from Brian. When Brian disappears, Julia realizes that more is going on than she's being told, and her tenuous relationship with Connor is tested. Initially, Julia seems too good to be true, but she develops along with the story, making for another of Kane's absorbing

tales of romantic suspense. —Patty Engelmann

RUN FOR YOUR LIFE

Following a string of historical romances, Kane (The Theft; The Gold Coin) plunges into the popular world of contemporary romantic suspense. Kane's strong suit is her ability to create memorable characters; consequently, the plot is driven not only by events, but also by the wants, fears and histories of heroine Victoria Kensington, a 28year-old Manhattan attorney, and hero Zachary Hamilton, a brilliant 30-something intelligence expert. Victoria's fear of dependence, rooted in her relationship with her Machiavellian father, caused Victoria and Zach's initial breakup four years earlier and hinders their getting back together after an incident in Central Park involving Victoria's unstable sister, Audrey, apparently running from unknown pursuers in a hospital gown. Audrey's flight and disappearance somehow involves the secretive Hope Institute, and not only forces Victoria to face her relationship with Zach, but also to deal with her father, who may be involved in drug smuggling with the Institute. What sets this book apart from other romantic thrillers is Kane's dest skill in defining the actions of her lead characters: her love scenes, for example, are exceptional, neither euphemistic nor clinical. Though slow to start, her latest marks a decisive transition for Kane from genre fiction into the mainstream. (Nov.)

New York City attorney Victoria Kensington enjoys running in Central Park. That changes when her terrified sister Audrey literally stops her morning trek by fainting at her feet. Before she became unconscious, Audrey, wearing a hospital gown, warns Victoria and provides her with a phone number. Victoria races off to get help, but when she returns with a cop Audrey is gone.

Distraught, Victoria asks her rather, a powerful lawyer, if Audrey is in town instead of painting in her home in Florence, Italy. Victoria believes her dad lied to her and is somehow involved with what is happening to her missing sibling. Victoria begins to investigate, which brings her to the attention of the FBI who are looking at an illegal drug operation and their hired gun, her former lover Zach Hamilton. As Zach and Victoria rekindle their love, they work as a team to rescue Audrey from a group legally represented by her father.

Runfor Your Life is an exciting thriller that may be Andrea Kane's best novel to date. That is quite an accomplishment after her "Coin" series. The story line is filled with tension from the start and never lets up until the climax. The support cast augments the tale with tamily depth that provides insight into Victoria and her father. However, what marks a Kane novel is the realistic, nonstop action that hooks readers from beginning to end.
