Seven years ago Perth author Brooke Davis' mother died in a car accident. Davis was in Vietnam at the time and never got to say goodbye. But she found two ways of dealing with her grief: to adopt her mother's car and to write an extraordinary book about three misfits — an abandoned sevenyear-old girl, an eccentric old man and an elderly widow - who have lost loved ones and who find solace in each other's company. Davis' novel Lost & Found caused a sensation at this year's London Book Fair and has already been sold to more than 20 countries. Soon she'll be able to afford any car she wants.
